Except for special events, all handgun shooting must take place on the bays at Range 4.

All rules that apply to the main club also apply at the handgun club.

There are additional rules in this document that apply to activities at Range 4.

There is video monitoring of the range which may be reviewed from time to time.

Club Information

We are a non-profit, volunteer run club under the direct control of the Selkirk Game & Fish Association. All members are expected to contribute to the safe, clean and successful operation of the club. Clubhouses are only open for events or when range executive are present. There are six bays on our range, approved by the Manitoba CFO. Each of these ranges has specific conditions, please read this document completely.

4 RULES of FIREARM SAFETY

1. Treat every firearm as though it were loaded.
2. Always point the muzzle of a firearm in the safest direction.
3. Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on the target.
4. Be sure of your target and what is beyond it.

SHOOTING HOURS: NO SHOOTING IN THE DARK.

Shooting may start after 7am or sunrise whichever is latest. Shooting must end at sunset. No members should be at the club from 10pm-6am without prior approval from the club executive. Sun times may be found on the Environment Canada website.

RANGE CONTROL SIGN (RANGE IN USE / RANGE CLOSED) & GATE:

The Range Control Sign will be set to “Range Closed” when no one is at the club. To open and use the range you must change the sign as follows:

Before passing the gate, flip the Range Control Sign to read “CAUTION Range In Use CAUTION”. When leaving the club if there are no other members present the sign must be changed to read “Range Closed”. This sign is a safety sign required by the Manitoba CFO, the range is only closed for members during events on our calendar.

THE SIGN IN BOX:

It is mandatory for all members to “Sign In” before shooting. There is a sign book at the notice board just before the gate. Please enter the date and time, your name or membership number.

The Handgun Club range is for the use of Handgun Club members only. Regular Selkirk Game & Fish members can use the range ONLY if they are accompanied by a Handgun Club member. No other guests are allowed to shoot.

MEMBERSHIP CARDS / PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP:

The following documents are proof of membership:

- Paperwork from MWF (Manitoba Wildlife Federation) with name and date of membership.
- Paid invoice or email from club online membership system indicating paid membership.

MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

We are a Manitoba non-profit managed by a small volunteer board of directors. We consider all members to be club volunteers and the success of our club needs everyone to help.

- Every member is authorized to act as a Range Officer to enforce the range safety rules.
 - o Please be courteous and polite.
- Members are encouraged to report problems with the range or member conduct to the executive. - info@selkirkgameandfish.ca
- All members are requested to help novice shooters, or new members, to explain the use of club rules, advise and instruct when appropriate.
- **Members must pick up their trash and place it in the garbage bins, dumpster or take it home when done. 'Leave it better than you found it' All targets should be removed.** Brass should be picked up and live ammunition must not be left in trash cans or on the ground. If trash cans are full please notify the club executive – info@selkirkgameandfish.ca
- **NO FIRES ARE ALLOWED**

Members are encouraged to volunteer their time and skills for club improvements. Volunteers are needed to help with regular clean up, as Match Directors and for service on our board of directors. EVENTS

Range 4 will be closed for rentals, IPSC and MDPL matches throughout the year, please consult the club website for dates and particular details. <http://www.selkirkgameandfish.ca/events/>

RED SAFETY FLAGS AT EACH RANGE

Each range at the club has a small flag stand. When a Red Flag is up that means the range is active. When you are done shooting switch to a Green Flag.

FIRING LINES

A Common Firing Line must be used at each range/bay. You must not shoot ahead or behind the Common Firing Line. On ranges 2 and 4, members may establish a Common Firing Line ahead of the concrete or marked limits (closer to the backstop) but must not shoot from behind the concrete or Firing Line marker (further from the backstop)

CEASE FIRE

A 'cease fire' may be called to check or reset targets every 20 minutes or on the mutual consent of all shooters.

During a cease fire NO ONE may handle their firearms for any reason. Everyone must step back from the firing line. Magazines may be charged during cease fire as long as firearms are not handled. **DO NOT** charge magazines at benches.

Before declaring the range 'live' or 'hot' to start shooting you must ensure that:


- Everyone is back from downrange. Take a good look for any person that may be hard to see because they are kneeling, wearing camouflage or slow to return to the line.

When all members have returned to the firing line and everyone is ready to commence firing the cease fire has ended. Firearms may be handled, and shooting may commence.


TARGET HOLDERS

Members are expected to bring their own target holders. Some target holders may be available in the silver container, but it is not guaranteed. **DO NOT USE BARRELS, TABLES, BENCHES SIGNS OR OTHER CLUB PROPERTY TO HOLD TARGETS. DESTRUCTION OF CLUB PROPERTY IS CAUSE FOR LOSS OF MEMBERSHIP.**


Wrong! - Never on Post

STORAGE CONTAINERS & Props

The small silver container is open for general use with target stands, sticks and props. The locked containers may only be used during sanctioned matches. These items have been paid for through the IPSC & IDPA club matches. *Barrels, tires and other materials must not be moved from the storage area.*

ACCEPTABLE TARGETS

Shooting at club property is cause for cancellation of membership, this includes but is not limited to: Signs, furniture, barrels, garbage cans, structures, storage containers, safety tables, etc.

One important rule of shooting safely is to know your target and what is behind it.

Targets:

- Must not be placed where shots could strike the ground before hitting the end berm/backstop.
- Must not be placed in front or on top of signs or posts that hold target backers.
- Must not be set up on club furniture (barrels, tables, benches, signs, garbage cans etc.)
- Not Allowed
 - Metal centrefire rifle targets are not allowed.
 - Exploding targets are not allowed.

No glass, rocks, cement, computers, machines or appliances are to be used as targets. Tin cans or plastic bottles shall be picked up and disposed of in the garbage bins provided. Remove paper targets from target holders when done shooting. Keep the range and shooting tables clean for other members. (Club Rules section 13)


Range 4 Approved Activities

Range 4 is approved by the Manitoba CFO for the following activities:

- ALL BAYS - SHOOTING MUST BE CONDUCTED WITHIN BERMED AREA, AT OR IN FRONT OF THE MARKED FIRING LINE. SHOOTING INTO SIDE BERMS IS NOT ALLOWED.
 - Refer to list below or firing line markers in bays.
- Targets must be set up such that bullets will pass through the target and impact into the face of the end berm. Targets must not be placed low or on the ground where the bullet will impact the ground before it hits the end berm. Review 'Acceptable Targets' for more information.

- Firing Lines:
 - Bay 1 - Handgun maximum 25M from the rear berm.
 - Shotgun maximum 50M from the rear berm.
 - Rifle from static positions maximum 100M from the berm.
 - Bay 2, 3, 4, 5 - Handgun, Shotgun & Rifle all rimfire up to .308 Winchester maximum 25M from the berm.
 - Bay 6 – Handgun & Rimfire ONLY up to 15M from the berm.

Please use the safety areas or tables in the bays to case & un-case firearms, the parking lot is not a safety area. ***If you move a table, please put it back, keep the range clean and pick up garbage and targets when you are finished.***



MISCELLANEOUS

BUMP FIRING & EXPLOSIVE TARGETS:

Bump Firing is *prohibited* on the Selkirk Game & Fish property. Explosive Targets are *prohibited from use* on the Selkirk Game & Fish property (CFO Manitoba policy).

GATE OPERATION & SECURITY CAMERA:

The entry gate must be closed and locked at all times. The gate may only be left open for a sanctioned match or during board meetings. Cameras are in operation at the club.

PROHIBITED RIFLES & SHOTGUNS

Any firearms included in the 2020, 2024, 2026 OIC Gun Ban lists are considered prohibited, and MAY NOT be used. This includes any law enforcement members
